

## INSET 6th January 2025 & afterschool clubs

Just a quick reminder that Monday, 6th January, will be an INSET day, and children will return to school on Tuesday, 7th January. Please note that afterschool clubs won't start until the second week back, 13th January 2025. Our staff will be using the time after Christmas to plan an exciting range of clubs for the new term, and we'll let you know soon what will be on offer!

## Drop off and pick up

We are making some changes to the drop-off and pick-up routines to ensure everyone's safety. The school driveway is often busy during mornings and afternoons with deliveries, bin collections, and other vehicles, there is also a skip currently in this area. The recent storms have caused some trees to fall near the driveway, and we've noticed children running behind the parked cars during pick-up times, which is a significant safety concern. These changes are intended to reduce risks and prioritise the safety of all pupils.



# Drop-Off Changes:

Breakfast Club: No changes—children will continue to walk up the pavement to the main school entrance and must be accompanied by an adult. Breakfast club will run from 8.40am - 8.55am. Unfortunately, children arriving before or after these times will not be accepted in to club.

Foundation Phase (Nur - Y2): Children and parents will now enter through the main yard gate where Mr. Paynter stands each morning. Walk through the front yard, around the back of the school, and onto the second yard, where a member of staff will greet them at the blue gate outside the Foundation phase building. The main yard gate will open at 9:00am.

Junior Children (Y3 - Y6): No changes—children will enter through the main yard gate where Mr. Paynter stands each morning and remain on the front yard as usual. The main yard gate will open at 9:00am.

#### Pick-Up Changes:

Junior Children (Y3 - Y6): Pick-up will remain the same—children will be collected from their classrooms as usual. The main yard gate will open at 3:25pm. Children will come out of class at 3.30pm.

Foundation Phase (Nur - Y2): Parents will enter through the main yard gate, walk through the front yard, around the back of the school, and onto the second yard. Children will be dismissed from the blue gates outside the Foundation phase building. The main yard gate will open at 3:25pm. Children will come out of class at 3.30pm.

We appreciate your understanding and cooperation as we implement these changes to ensure the safety and well-being of all pupils. If you have any questions or concerns, please don't hesitate to get in touch.
